

INSTRUCTIONS FOR POSTER PRESENTATION

The time available for oral presentations being necessarily limited, posters has become the common and efficient way for many authors to present papers and to have plenty of time to meet with interested attendees.

Due to the unprecedented number of submitted papers, this is particularly true for this conference and a special attention have been paid to the organisation of the poster area, with 15 separated villages dedicated to specific topics:

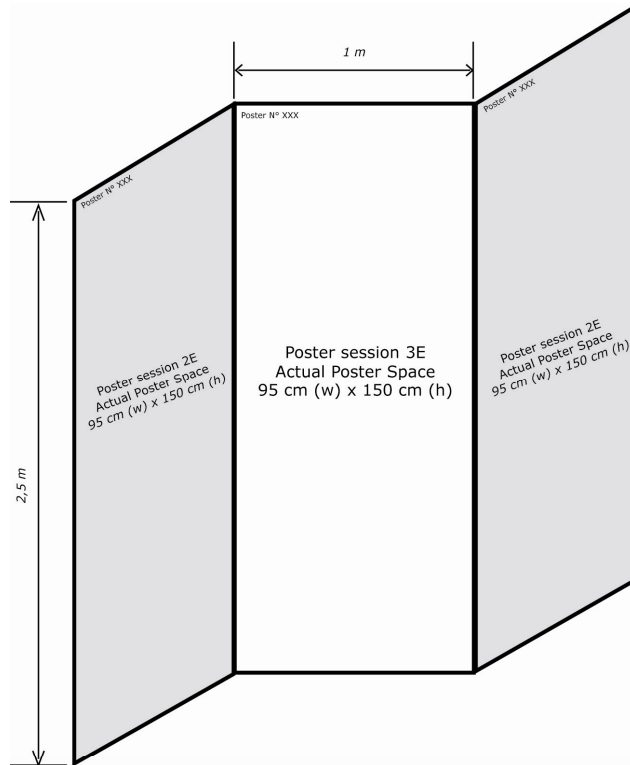
- **Mems Fabrication**

- **Cells Handling**

- **Bio & Chemical Sensors**

- **Physical Sensors**

We hope this organization will help attendees to quickly reach their main field of interest, and we encourage you to clearly display your message, so as to attract attention and permit a quick understanding of the key advance you are publishing. Please respect the following recommendations:

- The title of your paper should appear at the top of your poster in CAPITAL letters that are at least 2.5cm high. Below the title, put authors' names and affiliations.
- Use pictures, cartoons, and figures rather than text wherever possible. Bright colours will greatly enhance the attention of the viewer.
- Use text sparingly. Try to state the main result of your paper in 6 lines or less in lettering about 2cm high, so that people can read the poster from a distance. People will not read extensive text and certainly won't read typewriter sized text.
- The flow of your poster should be from the top left to the bottom right. Use arrows to lead the viewer through the poster.
- Make your poster as self-explanatory as possible, so that you will have time for in-depth technical discussions.

Posters Format:

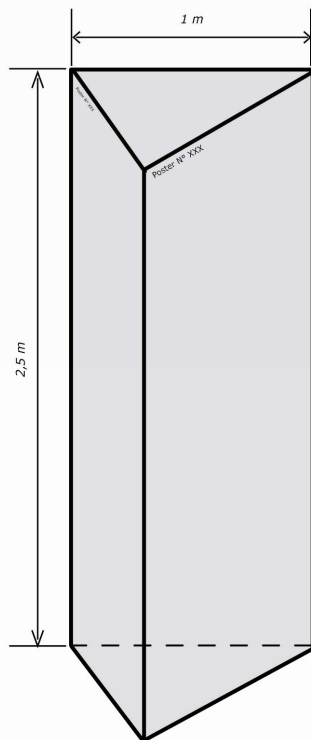
To present their work, authors will have vertical melamine poster boards with a usable surface of 1m wide X 2.5m high; there is approximately a 5cm border around the edge. **The actual space where you may place your poster is 95cm wide X 150cm high.** Double-sided tape will be provided for your use. The tape has a strong adhesive on both sides and will keep your poster secure and in place. Staples, nails and drawing pins are not authorized. Poster boards' material and colour is laminate in "honey".



Date and Time of Poster Sessions:

Tuesday, June 12th and Wednesday, June 13th, from 2:45 pm. to 5:45 pm. each day.

On your assigned day, please plan to spend the entire session at your poster for questions and discussion.



Set-up and Removal:

The room and poster boards will be available for you to set up on Sunday afternoon, June 10th, from 6:00 pm. to 8:00 pm. **Your poster presentation must be in place by 2:30 pm. on Monday, June 11th.** It will remain in place until 12:00 on June 14th, which will give additional time for attendees to view posters during breaks. All materials must be cleared out by 2:30 pm. Thursday, June 14th. You are responsible for collecting your poster. All posters left after 2:30 pm. on Thursday, June 14th will be discarded.
